That unforgettable season deposits the everwhistling Rose Llewellyn and her font-ofknowledge brother, Morris Morgan, in Marias Coulee along with a stampede of

homesteaders drawn by the promise of the Big Ditch--a gargantuan irrigation project intended to make the Montana prairie bloom. When the schoolmarm runs off with an itinerant preacher, Morris is pressed into service, setting the stage for the "several kinds of education" (none of them of the textbook variety), Morris and Rose will bring to Oliver, his three sons, and the rambunctious students in the region's one-room schoolhouse.
