Sally was born in La Plata in the former Physicians Memorial Hospital, grew up in the Nanjemoy area and attended Charles County public schools. She got married, had two children, drove a school bus while raising her family, and then started working for the Charles County Public Schools in the Food Service.

In 1976, Sally's husband bought her an art set. She tried to paint but nothing came out on canvas. She put the set away, but did drawings and crafts because she found them easier to do.

After studying the techniques of artists such as Bob Ross, Brenda Harris and Donna Dewberry, Sally



wanted to try painting again. Acrylic paints became available and she found they dried faster. That was back in 1992. Sally started painting and giving her artworks away as Christmas presents to

family and friends. She even painted school mascots, as well as the scenery around her property.


Sally has entered her art in the Charles County Fair and exhibited at the Mattawoman Creek Art Center. Her most recent painting was not on canvas but on molds of Old Durham Church, which were sold at their annual festival this past August.

As a child, Jan loved art.
Coloring books were her form of entertainment. Then, in her 30s, Jan got acquainted with oils and found out how easy it was to use them. She was fascinated with the colors and mixing them. Jan would paint some of the old masters using the grid method. It was a good way to learn, but with raising children and working, Jan got away from painting.



In the 1980s, Jan took a class at Southern Maryland College with Mr. Chappelear, and her interest was renewed. In his class, she used a 4" x 6" photograph and, in three days, painted it on a 3' x 4' canvas. In 2003, Jan took classes in acrylics and joined the Southern Maryland Decorative Painters. Through them, Jan was able to go to conventions and take classes from the best teachers in oil and acrylics.

Jan has also ventured into watercolors, and pen and ink, which consists of drawing the picture and then putting all of the details in with the ink. The drawings can either be in black and white or blended with oil colors.

Alliance, she has displayed her work in the United Way Building, the Commissioner's Gallery in the Government Center, the La Plata Senior Center and twice in the Waldorf West Library.

superstition. Inspired by the true story of Eyam, a village in the rugged hill country of England, Year of Wonders is a richly detailed evocation of a singular moment in history.





After growing up poor in Texas, Vera Lomax used every gold-digging trick in the book to land a rich husband. Now living

in luxury in San Francisco, her only job is to fawn over her much-older husband. So when her husband's mistress gets pregnant, Vera figures that a little hush money will ensure her husband's fortune is hers alone. Unfortunately for Vera, Sarah Cooper is the child Kenneth Lomax always wanted. When the father she never knew shows up at her mother's funeral to claim her, it's a fairy tale journey from the ghetto to a mansion on a hill. But Sarah knows that her step-mother is as two-faced as they come. And after losing all the family she's ever known, she wants a life that's richer than Vera has planned for her. As Vera and Sarah scheme to get what they want, everyone will be choosing sides, taking chances, and gambling it all to come out on top.




November 12: I Am Malala: The Girl Who Stood Up for Education and was Shot by the Taliban by Malala Yousafzai. When the Taliban took control of the Swat Valley in Pakistan, one girl spoke out. Malala Yousafzai refused to be silenced and fought for her right to an education. On Tuesday, October 9, 2012, when she was fifteen, she

was shot in the head at point-blank range while riding the bus home from school, and few expected her to survive. Instead, Malala's miraculous recovery has taken her on an extraordinary journey from a remote valley in northern Pakistan to the halls of the United Nations in New York. At sixteen, she became a global symbol of peaceful protest and the youngest nominee ever for the Nobel Peace Prize.
