unforgettable summer, Jack will begin to learn to love again, and he and his children will learn how to become a family once more.

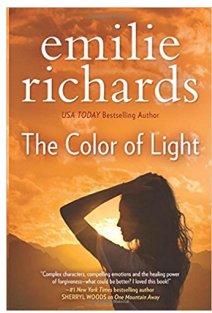

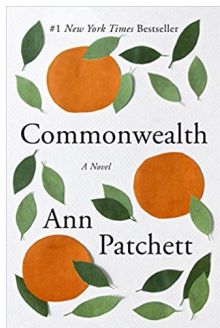

responsibility that bind us together.

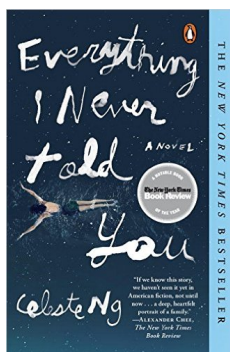

in which mothers and daughters, fathers and sons, and husbands and wives struggle, all their lives, to understand one another.

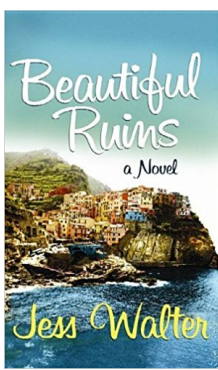

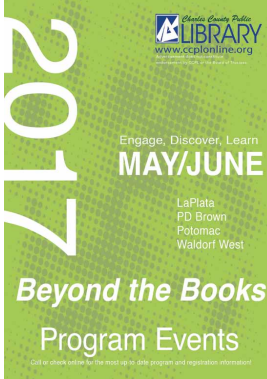
