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
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President's Letter

Dear Members and Friends,



We are well into Fall now and soon in October/November we will see bonfires and smoke curling out of many chimneys. So, I guess there is some "normalcy" in the midst of all this new normal. For us, there have been several innovations in our programming, and yet we have still had to make changes in our normal activities. Several of the art galleries we sponsor have new hangings to see and are open to the public once again. We expanded our Art Box program, with the help of CCBOE and the La Plata Target, and prepared 1,000 boxes for students in need of art supplies. Our CAD Grant program will be running a month behind with funds being released in December instead of in November. The Membership and Grant Award Gala has been canceled for this year, but we may still have a virtual format in January where grant recipients will share with us in person their plans and programs for 2021.

Soon we will have a list and calendar of venues and events, that although being canceled last Spring will be restarted and completed between January and June of 2021. Our staff will be presenting a new program on our YouTube channel called Second

Fridays. Some of our Board members are working on the development phase of an adult program in theater education. We will seek out scholarship recipients for our high schools, including for the first time St. Mary's Ryken. Hopefully, with the waning of the COVID-19 virus, we will bring back the ArtsFest in June of 2021.

We still need and ask for your support and hope that you will renew your membership when it is time to do so, and encourage others who have an interest in the growth of the arts to do so as well. •

October is National Arts & Humanities Month (NAHM)—a coast-to-coast collective recognition of the importance of culture in America. NAHM was launched by Americans for the Arts more than 30 years ago as National Arts Week in honor of the twentieth anniversary of the National Endowment for the Arts. In 1993, it was reestablished by Americans for the Arts and national arts partners as a month-long celebration, with goals of:


FOCUSING on the arts at local, state, and national levels; **ENCOURAGING** individuals and organizations to participate in the arts; **ALLOWING** governments and businesses to show their support of the arts; and

RAISING public awareness about the role the arts and humanities play in our communities and lives.

Get Involved!

Whether you've participated before or want to get involved for the first time, they have lots of ideas to help you celebrate. Here are four easy ways to bring NAHM to your community this October—and check their resources page for even more event ideas and tools.

- Join their 31-day Instagram challenge and encourage others to join, too! Find their daily themes and post along with them all month long using #ShowYourArt2019.
- Ask for a local government proclamation. Your mayor, city council, even your governor can officially declare National Arts & Humanities Month—and their sample proclamation (Word document download) will make it easy. (If you get one, make sure to send it to them!)
- Get the word out to the media, even if you've never spoken to the press before! Read their tips on working with the media (PDF download) to garner attention for your events. Download their press release template (Word document download) and customize it for your community. Or, get advice on how to write an op-ed or letter to the editor (PDF download) for your local paper.



• Host a Creative Conversation in your community. Gather local leaders (make it formal, or not!) to discuss the topic "How is the past shaping the future of the arts?". Learn more about how to start or find an event on our Creative Conversations resource page.


